Fauna & Flora

Fauna & Flora saves species from extinction and habitats from destruction, while improving the livelihoods of local people. Our guiding principles are to work with and alongside local partnerships, act as a catalyst for change, make conservation relevant, and base decisions on sound science. Founded in 1903, Fauna & Flora is the world's longest established international conservation body; our conservation work, and impact, spans the globe.

Fauna & Flora Indonesia Programme

Fauna & Flora established a formal country programme in Indonesia in 1996 with a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ministry of Forestry. We have since built up an extensive network of partners ranging from forest-edge communities and civil society organizations to government and private business. People are at the center of our conservation initiatives. We are at the forefront of efforts to help communities map their customary forests and gain official recognition of their right to manage these areas. Fauna & Flora's innovative approach has catalyzed change through a number of flagships programmes in Indonesia, including the community ranger initiative which has transformed former combatants, wildlife poachers and loggers into champions of the environment. We are also pioneering sustainable financing mechanisms through Payment for Ecosystem Services initiatives in our project sites.

South Sulawesi Conservation Programme

Fauna & Flora International's Indonesia Programme (Fauna & Flora-IP) is currently implementing conservation projects in South Sulawesi. One of them is "Long-Term Protection of the Maros-Pangkep Karst Landscape" in Maros and Pangkajene-Kepulauan (Pangkep) Regency by promoting the status of Biosphere Reserve in Bantimurung-Bulusaraung National Park and initiating Essential Ecosystem Area (KEE) of Maros-Pangkep Karst. In the latest project, Fauna & Flora-IP will run a conservation project in Gandang Dewata National Park, administration of South Sulawesi, which will be promoted as the new protected area of the KEE.

The goal of the Marine Project is to secure seascape through community-based coral reef fisheries management for conservation in Indonesia's marine biodiversity hotspot in Spermonde's south Sulawesi, Indonesia.

This project has four main objectives, namely:

1. By EOP, two fishing communities have implemented the Ecosystem Approach for Fisheries Management (EAFM) with support from MPA/Geopark managers
2. By EOP, two communities are actively co-managing their fisheries resources through monitoring and surveillance patrols
3. Fisheries as livelihoods in two coastal communities are more secure and sustainable through implementation of Participatory Market Systems Development
4. By 2026, the management and zoning plan of the Geopark for the Spermonde Karst island include actions to mitigate land-based impacts on marine ecosystems.

The Opportunity

Fauna & Flora Indonesia Programme is currently seeking candidates of Indonesian nationality for the position of Community Development Officer Podang-Podang. Under the supervision of the Sulawesi Marine Project Coordinator, the Community Development Officer manages the marine assistance program for community livelihoods program with a focus on Podang-Podang Islands, Pangkajene Kepulauan Regency and future expansion in several districts and provinces and at the Provincial level. The Community Development Officer works in close collaboration and coordinate with the Senior Field Officer and Community Facilitation Officer.

Purpose:

The main duties are: contributing to the marine projects of FFI and partners, working at the grassroots, strengthening partnership relationships between communities and management units

and the local government, strengthening locally managed marine areas (LMMA), and developing community-based monitoring and surveillance tools.

Specific Duties:

- Identify potentials community business
- Support business improvement program for selected community business group.
- Facilitate the routine programs (meeting, workshop, participative survey, FGD, and others program) to strengthen community capacity;
- In a team, create and develop marketing media and others to enlarge the community business;
- Actively involved in local community outreach to develop group participatory improvement which is biodiversity friendly and sustainable community business;
- Expand stakeholder and community to increase the quality of production and community business networks;
- Provide activity report, monthly report, and input for technical reports

Other duties:

- Manage files, documents, tools, and logistic needs of field programs;
- With volunteers and local team, coordinate and develop community organising plans;
- In a team, examine the findings, inputs, outputs, and challenges found in the fields;
- If necessary, attend consultation meeting(s) with stakeholders to build a common vision of preservations;
- Be actively involved in local community outreach in order to enhance awareness of biodiversity;
- Assist the program coordination and routine coordination with related stakeholder;
